### **2023 SOFTBALL DIVISIONS**

- T-Ball:** Youth born in 2019\*, 2018 & 2017 (\*we request the parent assist with coaching the youngest). Introduction to softball basics (base running; batting; throwing/catching). All players bat each inning and no score is recorded.
- 3-Pitch:** Youth born in 2016, 2015 & 2014. Players bat at 3 pitches from their Coach. All players bat each inning, and players advance to base if they hit the ball and are not thrown or tagged out. No score is recorded.
- Atom:** Youth born in 2013, 2012 & 2011. Modified softball rules apply. Players pitch. No base-stealing or sliding. Score is recorded.
- PeeWee:** Youth born in 2010, 2009 & 2008. Normal softball rules apply, including base-stealing and sliding. Score is recorded.
- Bantam:** Youth born in 2007, 2006 & 2005. Normal softball rules apply, including base-stealing and sliding. Score is recorded.

**GAME SCHEDULES** - Schedules will be emailed and posted on the MMAA website. We endeavour to have each team play 10 to 12 regular season games, depending on the number of teams in each division. Each team normally plays 2 games per week on weekday evenings. There are no set game days of the week, as there multiple teams per division; and each team will play each of the other team a few times per season. In addition, there may be an occasional rain day make-up game scheduled on weekends. Teams in the older divisions may also have a few scheduled practices.

**GAME TIMES** - Coaches and players should arrive at the diamonds between **5:50 pm and 6:00 pm**. Coaches want time for team warm-up, practice and skills development before games. **Game start time is 6:30 pm**.

**GAME CANCELLATIONS** - Games may be cancelled due to rain and/or wet field conditions. Please do not assume games are cancelled just because it may be raining where you live. **If games are cancelled**, a league-wide cancellation notice will be emailed as early in the day as possible, but no later than 5:30 pm. Cancellations will also be posted on the MMAA website homepage. Please do not text or telephone. Rained-out games will be re-scheduled if possible.

**WEATHER** – Don't be fooled! Players and spectators need to be prepared for very cool and breezy weather at the ball diamonds, especially in May. Dress appropriately. Hats, mitts, winter jackets and blankets are recommended.

**TEAM SELECTIONS** - Registered players are assigned to teams using a balance of age, gender, and Coach-evaluated player skill level from the previous season. Players from the same immediate family, in the same division, will be put on the same team. Special requests can sometimes be accommodated but **are not guaranteed**. Every player/parent will be contacted by their Coach at least one week before the season starts to advise which team they are playing on; when their first game is; and whether there is a pre-season team practice.

**EQUIPMENT** - Except for ball gloves, all other player equipment is provided. Please write a name in the glove. The 3-Pitch and Atom Divisions use 11 inch balls; and PeeWee and Bantam Division uses 12 inch balls. If a

player brings their own bat, it must be labeled “*Official Softball Bat*”, and the bat must be available to use by all players, on both teams.

**CLOTHING** - Every player will be given a sponsored T-shirt and a ball cap to keep and wear for all games, as expected by the team sponsor (jackets are permitted to be worn when it is cool, preferably under the shirt). For MMAA insurance purposes, all players must wear **running shoes and long pants**. (We suggest a pair of long pants and shoes be kept in your vehicle in case your child arrives without). Sandals and flip flops are not permitted. Rubber cleats are permitted; metal cleats are not. Unless prescription, sunglasses are not to be worn on the playing field.

**TEAM PHOTOS & AWARDS**- Team photos will be taken, however there are always no-show players or missing uniforms. When the date and time for pictures are scheduled, please make every effort to attend that game, dressed in team uniform. As soon as the season is completed, the digital team photos will be made available. All teams play on Tournament Day, and Awards will be presented to all players.

**VOLUNTEERS** - Want to get involved as a volunteer? Just complete the volunteer section on the registration form. We always need Coaches, Scorekeepers, Field Maintenance help, Tournament & BBQ day help, etc.

**COACHES / ASSISTANT COACHES** - The only prerequisite is a desire to help the players and have fun. If you have some softball/baseball knowledge – even better! Each team needs one Head Coach and one or more Assistant Coaches. We will run through the basics with any new Coaches. The **Coach Orientation Clinic** will occur on **Tuesday April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2023, from 7 pm to 9 pm** at the Murillo Community Centre.

**VULNERABLE SECTOR CHECK** - Coaches and Assistant Coaches 18 years and older must present a **Police Vulnerable Sector (VS) Check** obtained within the last three years; or needs to obtain one. The MMAA will provide instruction and a letter to obtain the Volunteer rate. With your receipt, the MMAA will reimburse you for the volunteer cost. A VS check from another youth recreational activity; school; or employer will be considered if obtained within last 3 years.

**UMPIRES** - Our youth are the game officials. Any registered MMAA players, born in 2012 or earlier, are eligible to be Umpires. Umpires can choose to be paid or they can use the time as credit for high school volunteer hours. All Umpires **must attend one pre-season umpire clinic**, where the rules and responsibilities are discussed. **Umpire Clinic(s)** will be held on **Saturday April 15<sup>th</sup>, from 10 am to 12:30 pm**; and on **Sunday April 23<sup>rd</sup>, from 10 am to 12:30 pm**, at the Murillo Community Center.
